ORDINANCE NUMBER 6

CITY OF TOWER, MINNESOTA

An ordinance for the preservation of public peace and for the protection of the public welfare and good order in the City of Tower and providing a penalty for a violation thereof.

The City of Tower Ordains:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful within a public street, ground, or thoroughfare, or in any public theater, shell, hall, shop, store, or other public place within the limits of the City of Tower for any person to take part in, incite, or encourage any fight, brawl, disorderly noise, riot, or other disturbance to the public peace, or within such public place to commit or encourage the making or committing of any assault or battery, or to appear in such public place in a state of open drunkenness, or for any person to appear in such public place in any indecent or lewd dress or in such public place to make indecent exposure of person or to use any profane, immoral or indecent language, conduct, or behavior.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to use in reference to and in the presence of another, or in reference to or in the presence of any member of the family of another abusive language, intended, or naturally tending to provoke an assault or any breach of the peace.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred (\$100.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety (90) days.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication.
